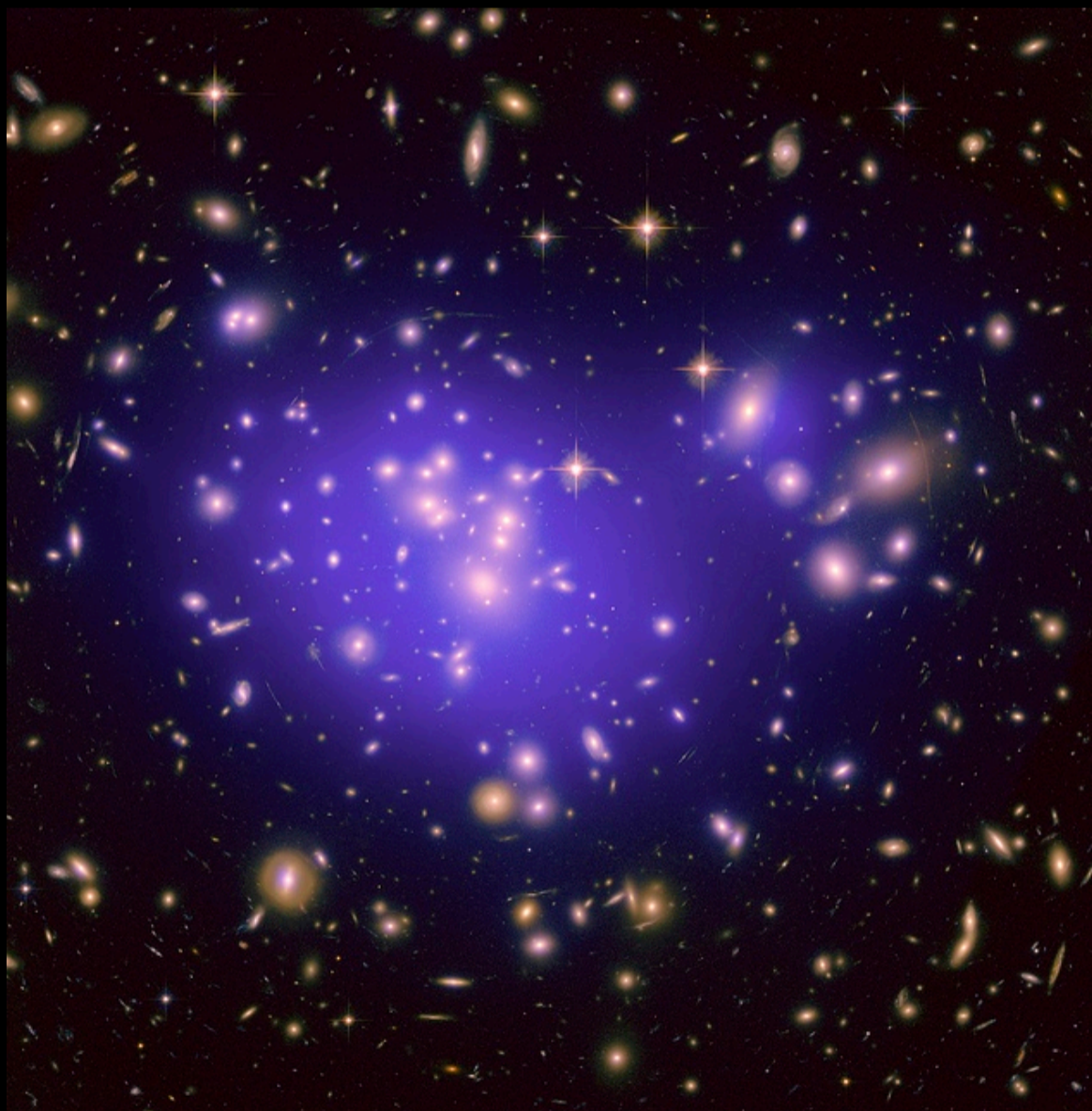
When Bad Things Happen to Good Galaxies
