The central plateau of the Antarctic provides the best location on Earth for conducting radio astronomy, cosmology and atmospheric science. In this talk I will explain why Astronomers from around the world travel to the Antarctic to carry out their research. I'll describe the experience of traveling, working and living at the South Pole. A brief history of Astronomy in Antarctica will be presented followed by an outline of current experiments and their results.
