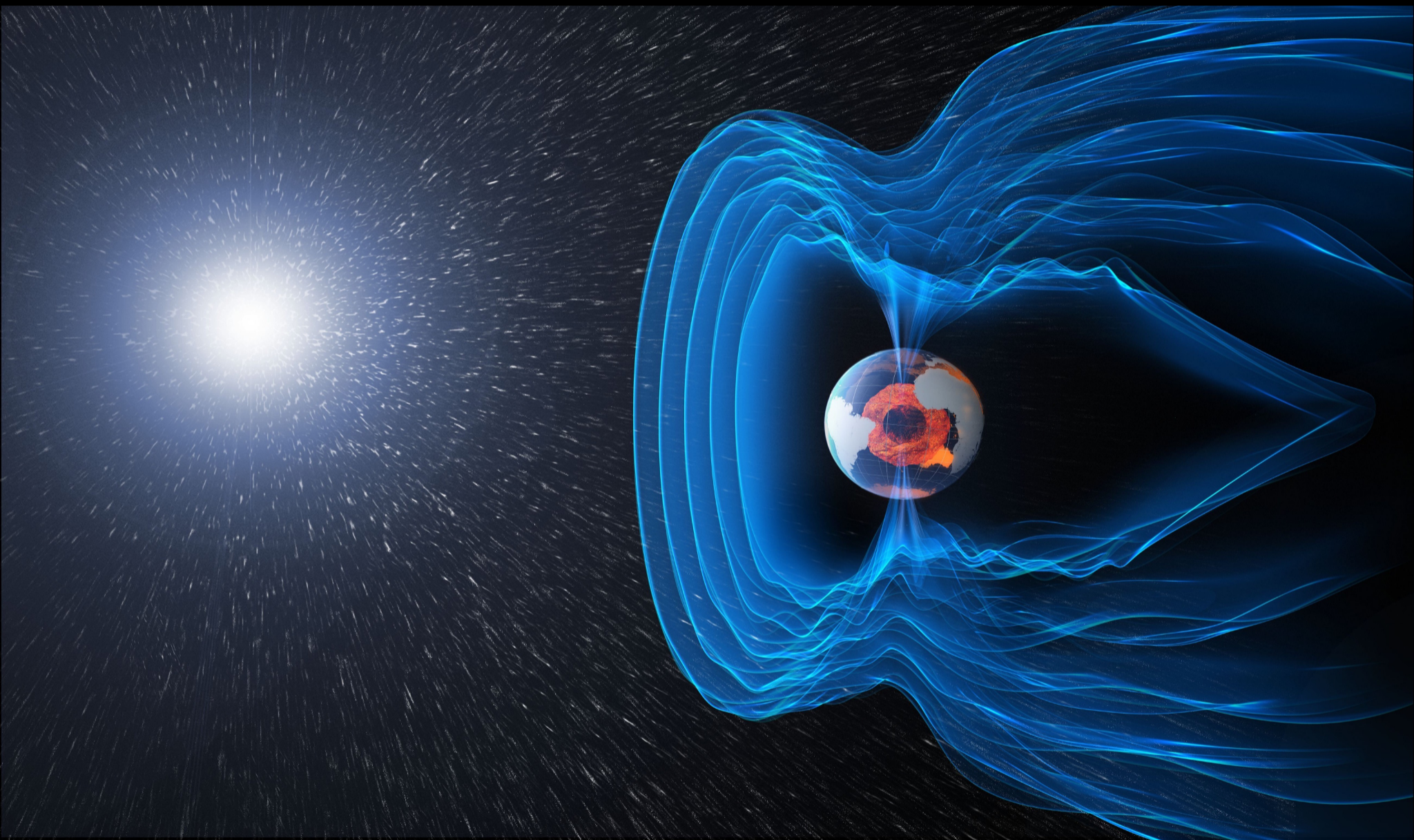
STARGAZING & LECTURE SERIES
