It's hard to believe, but the solar neighborhood is still unexplored territory. Over the past several years we have uncovered a population of super-Jupiters that are either old frozen worlds a short distance from the Sun, or young hot objects in nearby associations. The focus of this talk will be on understanding the similarities and differences between these rogue worlds without host stars and their sister planets in nearby extra solar systems:
